The Director is an integral part of all land use and transportation decisions, guides and influences private and public investments, and advocates for neighborhood, business, and destination amenities.

This team member also leads acquiring, analyzing, and assembling compelling data points related to development, demographics, and other topics pertinent to projects and representing UCP as the market expert. Representation of data and analysis may be through reports, maps, tables, etc.

The Director leads implementation efforts with professionalism and genuine passion for the work and advances the mission of UCP by working with the city, county, and state governments, as well as developers, institutions, business, property owners, residents, and special interest groups.

This position reports to the President and CEO.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES – Planning and Development

- Execution and Implementation of the Vision Plan 2021 Lead and support activities related to the Vision Plan, including assessment of goals and objectives, developing and executing strategies to accomplish goals, and reporting of progress.
- Rezoning and Planning Support Keep updated on all University City-related rezoning activities and other
 planning efforts by property owners, the development community, and city, county, state, and federal
 developments. Represent UCP's interests and vision in all rezoning efforts.
- <u>Planning and Design Charrettes</u> Plan, execute, and lead the follow-up on design charrettes for the local community. Work directly with key partners, like city, , county, and state government. Create reports and marketing collateral to share both internally and externally.
- <u>Placemaking Initiatives</u> Coordinate efforts with the president, board, and community on placemaking initiatives. Develop partnerships with artists, organizations, and institutions to execute initiatives.
- <u>Development Strategy</u> Support UCP's vision and design principles regarding commercial and residential development in the areas of density, connectivity, and urban planning, as outlined in the Vision Plan and the City of Charlotte's 2040 plan.



- <u>Facilitating the Development of Vision</u> Support activities that bring community stakeholders together on the education and further development of the vision of the University City area.
- <u>Community Advocacy</u> Advocate for community stakeholders when priorities and vision align with the goals and objectives of UCP.
- Research and Analysis Provide up-to-date research and analysis on developments, economic trends, commercial and residential activities that impact University City.
- <u>Economic Development and Planning Committee (ED&P)</u> Staff UCP's ED&P committee, providing the research, insights, and trends on economic impact of current and potential developments in the UC area.
